The Ministry of Foreign Affairs presents its compliments to all Diplomatic Missions, Consular Representatives and International Organisations (DCIOs) in Thailand and, further to the Ministry's Note No. 0905/c.575 dated 31 March B.E. 2563 (2020) on the declaration of an emergency situation in all areas of the Kingdom of Thailand due to the outbreak of the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), has the honour to inform the DCIOs as follows:

1. Members of the DCIOs and government representatives as well as their families pursuant to Clause 3 (4) of the Regulation issued under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005) (No. 1), at the port of embarkation, are required to present a Certificate of Entry into the Kingdom of Thailand issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs; a completed Declaration Form; and a Fit to Fly Health Certificate issued no more than 72 hours before travelling. Upon entry into the Kingdom of Thailand, they will be subject to a 14-day self-quarantine under the supervision of the respective DCIOs at the address of residence provided in the Declaration Form. Additionally, to ensure public safety, the DCIOs are required to inform the Ministry if anyone under their supervision is tested positive for COVID-19.

2. Honorary Consul-Generals and Honorary Consuls pursuant to Clause 3 (4) of the Regulation issued under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005) (No. 1), at the port of embarkation, are required to present a Certificate of Entry into the Kingdom of Thailand issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs; a completed Declaration Form; and a Fit to Fly Health Certificate issued no more than 72 hours before travelling. Upon entry into the Kingdom of Thailand, they will be subject to a 14-day state quarantine at a government-designated facility at their own expense.

3. Non-Thai nationals who have work permit or have been granted permission from the government agencies to work in the Kingdom pursuant to Clause 3 (5) of the Regulation issued under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005) (No. 1), at the port of embarkation, are required to present a Certificate of Entry into the Kingdom of Thailand issued by the Royal Thai Embassy or the Royal Thai Consulate-General in their country of departure; a completed Declaration Form; and a Fit to Fly Health Certificate issued no more than 72 hours before travelling. Upon entry into the Kingdom of Thailand, they will be subject to a 14-day state quarantine at a government-designated facility at their own expense.

4. Only through solidarity and cooperation can the spread of COVID-19 be successfully contained. It is therefore of utmost importance that everyone

in Thailand, including members of the DCIOs and their dependents must comply with the government's disease prevention measures, pursuant to Clause 11 of the Regulation issued under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005) (No.1).

5. The DCIOs may direct inquiries to their counterpart desk officers.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs avails itself of this opportunity to renew to all Diplomatic Missions, Consular Representatives and International Organisations in Thailand the assurances of its highest consideration.
