Members of the Royal Thai Military, the Royal Thai police, the Thai Government attachés in Thailand, Distinguished Guests and Ladies and Gentlemen,

At the outset, I would like to express my deepest gratitude to all our guests attending tonight's Reception commemorating the 70th Anniversary of the Japan Self Defense Force.

Japan's Self Defense Force was formally established on the 1st of July in 1954. The world has gone through turbulent times since then, but these forces have been dedicated to maintain peace and security in Japan as well as the region.

Using this occasion, I would also like to introduce his successor, Colonel Umetani Eiji. I hope you can continue to provide Colonel Umetani with the same level of support as you did.
