[Strategy] In the environmental area, cooperation will be provided to solve environmental issues such as air pollution and waste, which have become increasingly complex and sophisticated with economic development. With regard to climate change countermeasures, we will cooperate in the promotion of diverse and realistic energy transitions and the realization of energy conservation in order to contribute to the realization of the Thai government's roadmap toward decarbonization.
